**STATE CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR ASSOCIATION
HAWAIIAN DIVISION
BYLAWS**

Article I - Offices

Section 1. The principal office of the corporation shall be located in the State of Hawaii.

Section 2. Office for the various chapters may be established and located on any of the major islands in the State of Hawaii by the Board of Trustees. Said offices shall be subject to the provisions and conditions set forth in these Bylaws.

Article II - Official Seal and Purposes

Section 1. The corporation shall have a corporate seal which shall be in such form as shall be approved from time to time by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. As declared in the Charter of Incorporation, this Corporation was formed in 1917 by the members of the Hawaiian Division of the Christian Endeavor Association of Hawaii (formerly "Ahahui Ho'oikaika No Na Hana Karistiano O Ka Teritori O Hawaii," hereafter referred to as Christian Endeavor Hawaii) for religious, charitable, and educational purposes sponsored by the membership.

Article III - Membership and Dues

Section 1. There shall be two classes of membership as follows:

A. Church Members

(1) Any evangelical church organization that has incorporated within the State of Hawaii shall be eligible as a member of this Corporation; provided that such evangelical church organization is recognized by the State Christian Endeavor Association — Hawaiian Division and is in good standing with the Corporation as outlined in the policies of joining Christian Endeavor Hawaii.

(2) As a Church member, each evangelical church organization shall have a total of three (3) votes at all Christian Endeavor Hawaii membership (annual and special) meetings.

B. Individual Members

(1) Any individual who wishes to be active in the Christian Endeavor movement and who is a member of a nonparticipating Christian Endeavor church, and is in good standing with the Corporation as outlined in the policies of joining Christian Endeavor Hawaii.

a) As an Individual member, each Individual member shall have a total of one (1) vote at all Christian Endeavor Hawaii membership (annual and special) meetings.

b) Upon payment of annual dues, Individual members shall have all rights and privileges granted a Church member.

Churches and Individuals may join the State Christian Endeavor Association -- Hawaiian Division by sending their respective applications along with membership dues to the business address of the Corporation. Upon the acceptance and approval of the

Executive Board at its regular meeting, the individual or society will receive a Membership Certificate as notice of approval into the State Christian Endeavor Association, Hawaiian Division.

Section 2. Membership Dues: All members shall be assessed annual dues according to an annual fee schedule to be determined by the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Only members in good standing are entitled to vote at annual or special meetings of the Corporation or at any meeting of the various Chapters.

Section 4. Members may be deemed not in good standing if they fail to pay their dues or fees. The Secretary shall maintain a list of all members in good standing.

Article IV - Board of Trustees

Section 1. There shall be a Board of Trustees of the Corporation consisting of not less than seven (7) nor more than fifteen ~~(15)~~(11) persons all of whom shall be members of the Corporation.

Section 2. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of all the officers enumerated in Article V, Section 1; a member from each major island if appropriate; **West Hawaii, East Hawaii, Oahu, Maui and Kauai if appropriate** and ~~at least three (3) at large trustees who~~ shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Corporation.

Section 3. Any Trustee shall be subject to removal at any time by the affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the members of the Corporation.

Section 4. ~~An at-large~~ A Trustee shall be elected for a term of ~~one~~ **(two)** years and shall serve until their successor shall have been duly elected and qualified. The nominees receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected depending on the vacancies of the Board.

Section 5. In the event of a vacancy or temporary absence in the Board of Trustees involving any elected officer as enumerated in Article V, Section 1 of these Bylaws, except the temporary absence of the President or a vacancy involving his office, the Board of Trustees may appoint an Acting Trustee until such office is filled by a regular elected officer; or, in the case of temporary absence, the office is resumed by the regularly elected officer. One person may hold more than one office.

Section 6. In the event of a vacancy or temporary absence in the Board of Trustees involving a Trustee from a Chapter, the Board of Trustees may appoint an Acting Trustee until such Trusteeship is filled by a regularly elected Trustee or resumed by the regular Trustee.

Section 7. In the event of a vacancy or temporary absence in the Board of Trustees involving a Trustee elected at-large, the Board of Trustees shall appoint a successor trustee for the remainder of the vacant term or a temporary trustee until the regular Trustee is able to resume his duties.

Section 8. The Board of Trustees will have a post-convention meeting. The purpose of the meeting is to set dates for Fall and Spring Board meetings and to appoint committee chairmen to resolve unfinished business and to set proposed programs. A majority of the Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and the vote of the majority of Trustees present shall be sufficient to transact any business of the Corporation, except in cases where a larger vote is required by the Bylaws.

Section 9. Special meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called at any time by the President or by three (3) Trustees. Reasonable notice of such special meeting stating the authority for the call of the meeting and the place, day and hour thereof, shall be given to each trustee by the Secretary or person(s) calling the meeting. Notice may be given in person, by telephone, **by email** or mail. Non-receipt of any such notice shall not invalidate any business done at any meeting at which a quorum

is present

Section 10. The Board of Trustees may authorize the expenditure of funds of the Corporation for transportation and Board expenses of the Trustees from outlying Chapters.

Section 11. The property, affairs and business of the Corporation shall be under the control of and managed by the Board of Trustees which may exercise all the powers of the Corporation except such as are by law or by the Charter or by these Bylaws expressly conferred upon or reserved to the members; and in furtherance, not in limitation, of said general power, and in addition to all powers in them vested or implied by any provision of these Bylaws the Board shall have power: to control the acquisition and disposition of property; to appoint such agents and employees as in its judgment of the business of the Corporation may require, and to confer upon and delegate to them by power of attorney or resolution otherwise, such power and authority as the Board shall determine; to fix the salaries or compensation of any and all officers, agents and employees of the Corporation, and in the Board's discretion to require security of any of them for the faithful performance of any of their duties; to make rules and regulations for the transaction of business; to instruct the officers of the Corporation with respect to their duties; to incur such indebtedness as may be deemed necessary, and to secure or cause to be secured the repayment thereof by trust, deed, or mortgage of the property of the Corporation; to create such committees and to designate as members of such committees such persons as the Board shall determine; and to confer upon such committees such powers and authority as may be by resolution set forth for the Corporation; to create and set aside reserve funds of the Corporation in such securities or other property as the Board may deem proper; to enter into agreements and or contracts with other organizations to promote the Corporation's activities and functions, and to take all other necessary steps for the proper execution of said purposes not inconsistent with these Bylaws; to remove or suspend any appointed officer, agent, or employee for cause or without cause; and generally to do every lawful act necessary or proper to carry into effect the powers, purposes and objects of the Corporation.

Section 12. The Board of Trustees shall have power and authority to accept or to reject on behalf of the Corporation any and all gifts of money, securities and property offered to the Corporation with or without instructions, qualifications or stipulations as to the administration of such gifts.

Section 13. There shall be an Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees. The members of the Executive Committee shall be the President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary of the Corporation and one at-large trustee who shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees. The Executive Committee shall exercise such powers and responsibilities as may be delegated by the Board of Trustees.

Section 14. The Board of Trustees shall appoint the members of all standing committees and may establish such other committees that may be necessary from time to time.

Article V – Officers

Section 1. The principal officers of the Corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary and the immediate past President, all of whom shall be elected annually by the Regular and Individual members of the Corporation at the annual meeting and shall serve until their successors are duly elected and qualified. The nominees receiving the highest number of votes for each respective office shall be deemed duly elected. In case a tie results in the voting for any office, a special run-off will be conducted in accordance with procedures as prescribed by the present Board of Trustees.

Section 2. There shall be a Nomination and Election Committee appointed by the Board of Trustees. The committee shall nominate one or more candidates for each office as enumerated in Section 1 of this Article and, further it shall accept any nomination for any office if such nomination is submitted by a written petition, signed by at least fifteen (15) Regular and Individual members of the Corporation. All nominations made by written petitions for each of the respective offices shall be made or submitted not later than a date to be determined each year by the Committee.

- A. Nominees decided upon by the Committee should be contacted for their acceptance.
- B. The Committee shall conduct and supervise all nominations and elections.
- C. Announcements as to acceptance of further nominations by the Committee, written by petition should be announced no later than one month prior to the election date.

Section 3. The Board of Trustees may appoint such other officers as they may deem necessary, who shall have such authority and perform such duties as from time to time may be prescribed by the Board of Trustees. One person may be appointed to more than one office.

Section 4. All appointed officers shall be subject to removal at any time by the affirmative vote of a majority of the whole Board of Trustees.

Section 5. No elected officer may hold the same office for more than ~~three (3)~~ **two (2)** consecutive terms **of two years each.**

Section 6. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Corporation and the Board of Trustees. The President shall have general charge of the business and affairs of the Corporation, subject to the instructions of the Board of Trustees.

Section 7. The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President during the President's absence or disability or whenever the office is vacant, and shall have such other powers and perform such duties as may be assigned to them by the Board of trustees.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall have the custody of all funds and securities of the Corporation and shall be responsible for the safe-keeping of all money, note, bonds, deeds, mortgages, contracts, and other instruments in writing, belonging to the Corporation. The Treasurer shall be responsible for keeping all books and accounts and rendering statements thereof as may be required from time to time by the Board of Trustees. The Treasurer shall have such other books and papers as the Board of Trustees may designate, all of which shall be at reasonable times be open to the examination of any Trustee upon application at the office of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall have the authority to appoint as an agent, subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, such as bank or trust company as the Treasurer may designate, and upon such terms as shall be authorized by the Board of Trustees. The Treasurer shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Board of Trustees.

Section 9. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Trustees and at the Corporation in books provided for that purpose. The Secretary shall attend to the giving and serving all notices of the Corporation. The Secretary shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Board of Trustees.

Section 10. The immediate Past-President shall be a non-voting member of the Executive Board.

Article VI - Meetings and Notices

Section 1. An annual meeting of the regular members of the Corporation shall be held each year, and at such place as the Board of Trustees may determine.

Matters of the special business may be transacted at the annual meeting, if the notice shall

contain a statement of such special business or if all the regular members are present and waive notice of the consent to the transaction of such special business.

Section 2. Special meetings of the members of the Corporation may be called upon the request of the President or ~~four (4)~~ **three (3)** members of the Board of Trustees, or a majority of members.

Section 3. Notices of all meetings of the Corporation shall specify the time and place of the meeting by the Secretary and shall be mailed to each member no later than ten (10) days prior to the date designated for the meeting. Notice of every special meeting shall indicate briefly its purpose. Notice of all meetings of the members of the Chapter of the Corporation shall conform to these regulations and shall be mailed to each member at its last known mailing address, no later than ten (10) days prior to the time assigned for the meetings.

Section 4. At the meetings of the Corporation, the presence of a majority of members in good standing, shall constitute a quorum, A majority is defined as half plus one. The affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Corporation present at any meeting shall be necessary for the validity of any corporate act, except as otherwise provided by these Bylaws and the laws of the State of Hawaii.

Section 5. Proceedings and motions adopted at meetings in which a quorum is not present shall be considered valid and binding unless they are questioned and reconsidered at the next regular, quorum-constituted meeting, at which time decisions rendered will become final.

Article VII - Financial Management

Section 1. All checks, drafts, notes, bonds, acceptances, deeds, leases, contracts, and all other instruments shall be signed by such person or persons as shall be designated by general or special resolution of the Board of Trustees, and in the absence of such resolution, such instruments shall be signed by the President or Vice-President and countersigned by the Treasurer or Secretary.

Section 2. The financial affairs of the Corporation shall be audited at least once annually, and the auditor shall be elected at the annual meeting. The auditor may be a Regular or Individual member or a person or firm not associated with the Corporation; provided that no Trustee or officer and any firm that a Trustee or officer is associated with shall be eligible to serve as auditor.

Article VIII - Liability of Trustees and Officers

Section 1. The Trustees and officers shall, except as otherwise provided by law, be free from all personal liability for any acts done on behalf of the Corporation or for any loss incurred or sustained by the Corporation unless the same shall have occurred through their willful neglect or default or through gross carelessness. The property of the Corporation shall alone be liable in law for the payment of its debts and liabilities.

Article IX – Chapters

Section 1. The subordinate Chapters or Associations presently organized and sanctioned by the Corporation are situated on Oahu, Maui (Tri-Isles), East Hawaii, West Hawaii, and Kauai.

Section 2. Other Chapters of the Corporation which may be organized at various places within the State of Hawaii must be duly approved and recognized by the Board of Trustees of the Corporation.

Section 3. Each such Chapter shall have its own officers and governing board, to be elected by vote of the members of such Chapter. All officers and members of the governing boards of such Chapter shall be members of the Corporation.

Section 4. The property of all Chapters shall be the property of the Corporation.

Section 5. Each Chapter of the Corporation may adopt its own rules, regulations and Bylaws, provided they are in consonance with the objectives and purposes of the Charter or the provisions of the Bylaws of the Corporation.

Section 6. The Corporation through its Board of Trustees reserves the right to exercise control and supervision of any subordinate Chapter when it deems necessary to do so, and at any time when it so desires.

Article X - Standing Committees

Section 1. In accordance with Article IV, Section 14 of these Bylaws, standing committees or temporary committees may be created by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Specific policies governing the Standing Committees as to organization and operation will be drawn up as directed by the Board of Trustees and periodically revised to meet changing conditions.

Section 3. Specific policies adopted by a Standing Committee will be binding upon approval by the Board of Trustees. When such policies affect the general welfare of the membership, they shall be disseminated to the general membership.

Article XI - Standing Rules

Section 1. Standing rules not listed herein, nor covered elsewhere may be enacted by the Board of Trustees as the situation demands; they shall be as binding as any provision in the Charter or these Bylaws.

Article XII - Parliamentary References

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order as revised shall govern the Corporation when not inconsistent with the Bylaws or the Special Rules of Order of this Corporation.

Article XIII – Amendments

Section 1. The Bylaws may be amended or repealed by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Regular and Individual members present at any meeting duly called and held, notice of which shall have stated that the purpose of the meeting (annual or special) is to consider the amendment or repeal of the Bylaws, provided, however, that not less than a majority of members in good standing are present at such meeting shall constitute a quorum.
